Overview

The Twin City Figure Skating Association invites you to participate in the 2010 Minnesota State Figure Skating Championships, August 21-23, 2009. This competition is sponsored by the Twin City Figure Skating Association, hosted by the Northern Blades NSC FSC (www.northernblades.org) and conducted in the same manner as the 2010 U.S. Figure Skating Upper Great Lakes Regional Competition including the use of the IJS for Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior events. This competition is sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating. Kristin Arneson Cutler will be the Chief Referee. Lexie Kastner will be the Chief Accountant for this event.

Entry Fee

SINGLES: Fees are \$115 for the first event (Intermediate through Senior include the Short Program) and \$25 for any additional events.

PAIRS/DANCE: The entry fee for each pair team is \$120. If a member of a pair or dance team is also skating singles, the additional fee for the skater is \$25. As an example, if each member of a pair/dance team wishes to skate both as a single and as a pair/dance team, each member of the team would owe \$85 (\$60 as half of the team fee and \$25 for the second event).

Entry Deadline

Entries must be postmarked by July 3, 2009.

There will be **NO LATE ENTRIES accepted after the postmark date of July 3, 2009**, and there will be **NO REFUNDS after the closing date (July 3, 2009)**. All entry forms must be completely filled out with all required signatures to be processed. U.S. Postal Service meters and postmarks are the only acceptable proof of entry date.

PLEASE NOTE: A \$20.00 Service Fee will be imposed on all returned checks and additional civil penalties may be imposed for Non-Payment “pursuant to Mn. Stat 332.50”.

Rules

The rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the 2010 Official Rulebook, with changes and clarifications as posted on the USFS web site, will govern this competition with the following exceptions:

- *Pre Preliminary events are included.
- *Both the Short and Freeskate programs are used to qualify for final rounds (when applicable).
- *Please refer to the USFS web site often for technical notification up dates.

Eligibility

The competition is open to all registered U.S. Figure Skating members in good standing who are residents of the state of Minnesota, **OR** home club members of a Minnesota U.S. Figure Skating club 1 year prior to closing date of entries for MN. State.

1. Skaters may compete at either their current freestyle test level, or one level higher.
2. Elimination rounds will be conducted if necessary.

Facilities

Forgerty Arena has two ice surfaces. It is anticipated that competition events will take place in the South Rink and the North Rink will be used for practice ice and competition, if necessary. The competition surfaces are:

The concession stand will be available during the competition. There will be vendors.

Registration

The registration desk will be open Thursday, August 20, 2009, with the first practice session and will remain open during all scheduled events and practice sessions. All notices will be posted on an official bulletin board located by the registration desk. It is the responsibility of each competitor to check this board. Competitors should arrive at the Forgerty Arena 45 minutes before the scheduled time of their event. No events will begin ahead of schedule.

Music

Music will be played from CDs (standard format only in a hard-sided "jewel case") and must be clearly labeled with competitor's name and competition event. Music must be turned in at the time of registration and may be picked up at the registration desk after the event. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Proper care will be taken, but the TCFSA cannot accept responsibility for cassette tapes or CDs.

Practice Ice

Official practice ice is NOT included in the entry fee. Purchased sessions will be 30 minutes in length. Sessions will assigned on a first come basis. Each competitor will be notified of their practice time if **they send in a self addressed envelope with stamp**. It is anticipated that all competition events will take place in the South Rink. Every effort will be made to schedule your purchased practice ice on the South Rink. However, depending on the size of the competition, this may not be possible. Music will not be played at practice ice. See attached sheet for practice ice requests.

Awards

Awards will be presented during the course of the competition. Please check the bulletin board.

Individual Awards:

- *Awards will be presented to the top four (4) skaters in all final round events.
- *All champions (and one guest) will be invited to the 2010 Officials Appreciation dinner on September 13, 2009. Details will be given at the competition.
- *The Bette Snuggerud Scholastic and Skating Award will be awarded to a senior lady competitor displaying excellence both in the classroom and on the ice.
- *The James Disbrow Scholastic and Skating Award will be awarded to a male competitor displaying excellence both in the classroom and on the ice.
- *Event champions will be invited to skate in the 2010 Celebration of Champions. The location and time will be announced at a later date.

Competitors eligible for the Bette Snuggerud Award and the James Disbrow Award will be notified about the application procedure following the close of entries.

Team Awards:

- *A team trophy will be awarded to the club earning the most points.

Pictures and Videotaping

An official photographer will be at the competition. They will also be available upon request for taking professional pictures of any skater. An official videotaping service will be at the competition. You will be able to sign up at the photo/video desks for these services.

Area Hospitality

- *Hotel information is included with this package of information.
- *Directions to the Fogerty Ice Arena will be sent out with the registration confirmation.
- *Area hospitality information will be available at the competition.

- *Adult Pairs and Masters Pairs

and will be conducted according to the 2010 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook.

Singles Men/Ladies Freestyle Events

*Skaters may compete at either their current freestyle test level, or one level higher.

*For Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior events: These events are combined and will be conducted and judged exactly the same as in a qualifying competition according to the 2010 U.S. Figure Skating rulebook, with changes and clarifications as posted on the USFS web site.

*All events are skated with music on a full ice surface.

*Qualifying rounds (if necessary) are based on combined Short and Freeskating programs (Intermediate through Senior)

*Men's and Ladies' Adult Events may be combined at the discretion of the referee.
